

At Berrywood Primary School, we provide our children with a wide range of technology tools to enhance their learning of the curriculum, through the use of I-pads, lap tops and two computer suites. Whilst exciting and beneficial both in and out of the context of education, much IT, particularly web-based resources, are not consistently policed and users need to be aware of the range of risks associated with the use of these Internet technologies. Here at Berrywood Primary School, we understand the responsibility and importance of ensuring that the children are aware of and understand a range of e-Safety issues. For example, each time the children have access to the internet we remind the children of the SMART rules for using the internet.



Throughout the year, Year R to Year 6 provide regular, age appropriate, e-safety lessons to ensure that e-safety is kept at the forefront of our children's minds. Here are some examples of what is covered within each year group:

Year R - Careful handling of technology, class e-safety rules

Year 1 – Lee and Kim, being safe online

Year 2 - Telling an adult if you are upset about something you have seen online

Year 3 - Talking to unknown people online

Year 4 - Keeping your personal information safe online

Year 5 – Cyber bullying

Year 6 - Consequences of spending too much time online

Our responsibility doesn't end in the classroom. Berrywood Primary School holds an annual e-safety evening for parents and carers, where we provide up to date and relevant information about the online world. We offer guidance and practical advice to enable you to support your children at home and gain a deeper understanding of the digital world our children are growing up in.
