Curriculum

Project: 'The Vikings: Raiders or Traders'

Reading: How to Train Your Dragon by Cressida Cowell

English: This term we will be writing a Legend, based on the epic Anglo-Saxon poem, Beowulf, writing in the style of storyteller and performing our legends as they would have done during the Anglo-Saxon period. Our second unit this term will be writing a humorous explanation text about how our digestive system works, we will be using The Gooney, Chewy, Rumble, Plop Book as the stimulus for our writing.

Maths: In maths this term, we will be exploring the following topics; area and perimeter, mixed numbers and improper fractions, multiplying whole numbers and fractions, and finally using measures and comparison to understand scaling.

Science: In Science, we will be learning that an adequate and varied diet is needed to keep healthy, all about our teeth types and their function, and how we digest our food. We will plan and undertake an investigation to test various liquid's ability to erode tooth enamel and enjoy a fun practical which will mimic the way our body digests food.

Art: We will be exploring the concepts of weaving and dying materials to create our own textiles using wool, beads and other embellishments.

The Year 4 pupils are very fortunate to have 'Listen to Me' music lessons throughout the year, led by Hampshire Music Service. During these lessons, children get an opportunity to learn how to play some different instruments, as well as to continue their general music development and understanding. This term, the children will be learning the Recorders.
