## Projects

We will be focusing on an all-time favourite with the children; The Gruffalo and many other Julia Donaldson books over the coming weeks. As well as finding out about woodland animals and the change in the seasons. This will involve: lots of stories, art, role play, dressing up as well as opportunities for mark making / writing and lots of maths including counting, adding, dividing, and shape hunts. Not to mention exploring the outdoors through our welly walks. Naturally our biggest focus comes under the umbrella of Personal, Social and Emotional Development but we wanted to give you a flavour of the other areas on offer.

This will take us through to our build up to Christmas (surely it's not too early to mention that now?) where the magic of Christmas will come alive through lots of songs, creative activities, investigations with ice, lots of maths, reading, writing opportunities and of course, a nativity...it's not Christmas until you have seen a Year R nativity. We are also hoping to take the children on a trip to the train station in December to visit Father Christmas! This will be a very exciting first trip for the children. In the event of a bad weather forecast, we ask that you provide the children with wet weather gear and potentially a change of clothes. We will advise nearer the time on Tapestry.

## How can I help at home?



This is a question we get asked a lot and obviously the specifics are individual to each child but there are some things we can all do. Firstly, pick your time! As the weeks go by the children will become increasingly tired so reading, sound cards and so on can wait if your child is simply too tired. We are excited to introduce our new phonic scheme Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) to the children and we will be sending home books for you to share with your child at home. These books will link to the sounds we are learning in school, so any practise will greatly benefit your child. Life is busy and as we have said, children get tired. **If you do nothing else, please read to your child every day or at least 4 times a week.** The impact of this is absolutely immense.

Conversational maths is crucial, whether it's counting food like peas or beans, sharing out toys, talking about the time, counting coins, identifying shapes on your walk to school or recognising numbers in the environment.

We also ask if you could ensure your child can do up their own coats, practise eating with a knife and fork and be able to wipe their own bottom. This will all help them to feel more confident and independent in school.

## Reminders..

Attendance and punctuality are key to boosting your child's educational achievement as well as their confidence and well-being. A quick reminder, the classroom doors will be open at 8:30am and the gates will be locked at 8:45am. Anyone arriving after this time will be marked as late.
